**Everyday at the** Académie Notre Europe, we work to unlock young people's potential because they are Europe's next generation of changemakers.



### WE EMPOWER YOUNG PEOPLE

For the past nine years, the Académie Notre Europe has been offering a unique, free and inclusive leadership and citizenship programme designed to empower young Europeans to better understand, shape and lead the future of Europe.

Each year, 100 participants from 25–30 nationalities and diverse backgrounds take part in a yearlong training programme combining policy learning, civic engagement, and personal development. Through nine monthly sessions, they explore key

European challenges — from climate transition to social cohesion, competitiveness — guided by leading experts, policymakers and practitioners.

What makes the Académie distinctive is its experiential, inclusive and multiplier approach. Half of the sessions are accessible online, allowing participants from all regions to join regardless of financial or geographical barriers.



Our cohort is as diverse as it gets: some are future diplomats or journalists, others work in AI, on construction sites, in hospitals or as entrepreneurs. They all share one thing in common: a desire to make a difference. The impact of the Académie extends far beyond its yearly cohort. Our 600+ alumni

form an active network of European citizens who continue to contribute to their communities and share their experiences with future generations.

Beyond its training programme, the Académie reaches out to young people across Europe by creating spaces where they can meet, learn and act together. Each year, we organise flagship events like the Jacques Delors Conference, which gathers 200+ young people in Paris, as well as the Jacques Delors Agora, a fourday summer school hosted in a European city (Lisbon in 2024, Barcelona in 2025).

The Académie Notre Europe thus acts as both a **school of leadership and a community of purpose** — a living example of what non-formal education can achieve.

In nine years, the Académie has trained more than 600 young people in a spirit of openness, excellence, and shared learning.



## DIVERSITY COMES IN MANY FORMS

This year, our 116 young leaders represent a record-breaking 30 nationalities. More than a quarter come from a disadvantaged background.

Some are still studying, whether political science, journalism, cybersecurity, business. Some are already working, in AI, sustainable fin-

ance, construction, education. Some are entrepreneurs.

Many are involved in associations and community initiatives to help combat climate change, promote social inclusion, and fight disinformation.
